Minutes of the Second and adjourned FOURTH REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING of the State Highway Department, held in its temporary offices pursuant to adjournment. The following members were present.

The following business was transacted.

Delegations from the two routes between San Antonio and Corpus Christi were present and the following gentlemen addressed the Commission in the interest of their respective routes:

Thomas Newton, representing Bexar County; Judge W. J. Bowen, Atiscosa; D. J. Woodward, San Antonio; Mr. Swan, County Commissioner, Beeville; Honorable F. H. Burmeister, McMullen County; Senator W. O. Murray, Floresville; J. C. Caves, Oakville; Judge Klingerman, Karnes; Judge Childers, Sinton; T. M. Cox, Bee County; Roy Miller, Corpus Christi.

After two hours discussion Chairman Hancock advised the Committee that the Commission would inspect each Route commencing at San Antonio on September 27th and instructed the Secretary to arrange an itinerary of the trip.

Motion by Mr. Odle, seconded by Mr. McLean that the petition submitted by John M. Conely, et al., from Orange and Jefferson County, designating No. 8 through Mauriceville between Orange and Beaumont. (See petition on file). Petition granted.

Two Hundred Thousand seals were ordered from the Stafford Auto Lamp & Number Company, Dallas, for 1918, 2- $\frac{1}{4}$ cents each, as per contract on file in the Department.

Motion by Mr. Odle, seconded by Mr. McLean that Highway No. 7 be designated as follows: Centerville through Jewett, Personville, Groesbeck, Mart to Waco. Motion carried.

There being no further business coming before the Commission adjournment was taken until Wednesday morning September 12th.
