Minutes of the Fourth and Adjourned Twentieth Regular Session of the State Highway Commission held in the State Office Building with the following members present:

Curtis Hancock, Chairman
 R. M. Hubbard, Commissioner of Construction
 C. S. Fowler, Commissioner of Registration
 George A. Duren, State Highway Engineer
 J. D. Fauntleroy, U. S. District Engineer

The following action was taken:

Motion by Mr. Fowler, seconded by Mr. Hubbard, that Highway Number THIRTY-SIX be more particularly described as follows: that part of Highway Number Thirty-six between Cameron and Hearne shall be hereafter designated as Number 36-A.

That Highway Number THIRTY-SIX be extended from Cameron to Milano, thence to Caldwell, thence to Somerville, thence to Brenham, thence to Bellville, thence to Sealy, thence to Wallace, thence to Richmond.
 Motion carried.

Designation of 18-B:-

Motion by Mr. Hubbard, seconded by Mr. Fowler, that the petition of M. E. Rosser, T. J. Barrett, John J. Ford, W. H. Bledsoe, and Senator C. R. Buchanan, petitioning the designation of a highway, be granted, and that the highway described as follows be designated:

Beginning at a point 10 miles west of Albany at forks of State Highways Numbers 18 and 30, thence to Anson in Jones County, thence to Roby in Fisher County, thence to Snyder in Scurry County, thence to Gail in Borden County, thence to Lamesa in Dawson County, thence to Brownfield in Terry County joining the Northern Branch of Highway Number Eighteen. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Fowler, seconded by Mr. Hubbard, that the application of DICKENS County for State Aid be granted on Highway Number 18, beginning at the Dickens County line on the south, thence to Spur, thence west to the county line on said Highway Number 18, not to exceed \$37,000, or one fourth of the contract. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Hubbard, seconded by Mr. Fowler, that the following resolutions of respect to the memory of Bert Ramsay be passed:-

"WHEREAS, the Commission has learned of the recent death of our co-laborer, Bert Ramsay, of the engineering department, while in service and on duty as an employe of this Department; and

"WHEREAS Mr. Ramsay has shown a fidelity to duty and a deep appreciation of his work;

"THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the State Highway Commission, that we lament the untimely death of our co-worker, and express to his bereaved family our sympathy.

"It is ordered that this resolution be spread upon the minutes."

Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Commission, adjournment was taken.
